Welcome Back

A warm welcome back to the Summer Term of 2021. We start the term full of optimism now that more of our staff are being vaccinated, the Lateral Flow Testing is in full operation and our safety measures continue to be in place. New guidance was released from the Government regarding the running of schools, however, very little has changed for the primary sector. Therefore, we will continue to work within our year group bubbles, wear face masks in communal areas, have lunches and breaks at a distance and continue to hold our meetings and training via online platforms.

We ask parents to continue with the staggered start and finish times, wear face masks on the school grounds and to keep a distance when in the playground.

The annual events which usually take place in the summer term will also look a little different. Sports Day, trips, end of term celebrations will be reviewed and we will unfortunately have to welcome our new parents for September via Zoom. There will be no formal testing taking place (KS1 and 2 SATs, phonics, Y4 multiplication check), though we will of course still be carrying out assessments during the term so we can inform you accurately about your child's attainment in regard to their Age Related Expectations and also to pass on to the next teacher for September.

Please continue to support at home with learning tables, counting, reading, spelling, as well as engaging with the homework tasks which have been emailed home today.

THINK BEFORE PARK YOU PARK BE CONSIDERATE TO OUR NEIGHBOURS YOU COULD ENDANGER A CHILD'S LIFE

Once again, we have been experiencing problems with parking outside school at drop off and pick up times. Our main concern is the safety of our pupils. There must be no parking on yellow lines or zig zags at these busy times. There are signs which clearly state the times you can stop there. There are a number of white lines along East Avenue; Parking Reinforcement have told us that cars can only be parked here with the permission of the house owner.

There is now a form which can be filled in by anyone to report an illegally parked car. If there are parking reinforcement officers in the area, they will come straight over and ticket the car. I filled in the form this week to request the Parking Reinforcement camera car - this was responded to immediately. The Senior Leadership Team who are outside school will be using the form to report cars and I strongly urge parents to do this too. Please use the following link:

<u>School Car Park</u>: a reminder that the school car park is for staff ONLY. Blue badge holders can park on production of the badge as well as the <u>school</u> taxi. Other taxis who are dropping off must not enter the car park. Staff who arrive after 8.30am find it increasingly difficult to park and there are safety concerns for pedestrians exiting the school grounds.

Running Track

We currently have a wood chipped path which runs around the school field, separating the play areas and the Forest School/Outdoor Learning areas. This was created with lots of volunteers from the parents and staff and has been great. However, we would now like to develop this further. Firstly, we would like to make it more accessible in order for our wheelchair users and less mobile pupils to use it to access the log circles. We would also like to create a more 'all-weather' surface for the path to enable it to be used for our 'mile-a-day' activities, promoting exercise, well-being and fitness for our pupils. This will be an expensive project and we will be looking at applying for community grants to help us fund it.

We would be looking at opening the track to the community - though haven't planned the final detail of this yet. What we would like to know is whether this is something that would be of interest to you. Is this a facility you would like to use out of the school day? If we can gauge the interest from our community this will strengthen our application for funding.
