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Reward Day

As you are aware, we moved away from our House system of rewards this year in response to concerns from both parents and staff that rewarding a winning house did not always reward the children who had worked and behaved to a very high standard all year. We then moved to the bronze, silver and gold badge system, where children are rewarded for their own individual effort. This has been successful and the children have responded extremely well to the initiative. As this has been something new, we have found that not as many children have reached gold as we anticipated - we will have a better idea of how many merits can be given out next year and they will also be earned through reading at home and class dojos (more information to come about this).

We have decided that the staff will award additional gold badges on a discretionary basis in their classes to pupils who haven't reached a 100 merits, but certainly deserve to have done so. As the Reward morning is also linked to behaviour, any children who have had two or more detentions, will not be invited to take part.

All other children with gold badges will be able to take part in the Reward morning which is taking place on Tuesday 12th July. This will run on similar lines to last year with a visit from the ice cream man, bouncy castle, games and water fights. Thank you to Miss Arnold and Mrs Wilson for organising this and to the parents who have offered to help.

Summer Holiday Camps





After consultation with parents and the excellent feedback and questions put forward on the website Parent Forum, we are delighted to be able to announce the introduction of Summer Holiday Camps to be held at Etchells during the forthcoming holidays.

This will be run in partnership by the Marple Childcare Company and Footytotz. I must stress however, that the activities are not limited to football. There will be a range of sporting activities on offer as well as craft, cookery and imaginative play. 
YouNow

Have you heard of YouNow?!!

This was a new one on me! It is a fairly recent app which is currently being used by both primary and secondary aged pupils. It is used to watch and create live videos. The rules of the site state that it is intended for individuals aged 13 and above. It is possible for children to register however and not give their correct age. It is also possible for a child under 13 to watch broadcasts on the YouNow website or app without signing in or registering an account. The concerns around this app are that users can 'virtually tip' broadcasters. The more 'liked' a video is, the more 'virtual currency' they will earn. This in turn leads to an increase in the riskiness of the videos being posted.

Attached to this newsletter is a Parents Guide to YouNow which will give you the full information. It can also be found in the e-safety section of the website under the 'Additional' tab. Please read, be aware, talk through with your children and discuss the risks.
