We have really noticed an improvement with parking around school in the mornings and afternoons. Thank you for hearing our requests for safer parking, it really does make a difference!

East Avenue Park



We are aware that many families go to the park after school, especially on sunnier days. I would like to make a polite reminder, that after 3.15pm, the children

are the responsibility of parents and not the school. Please be vigilant in your supervision and mindful of the current COVID-19 regulations: groups of six (including children) or two households mixing. We are currently working with our Community Police Officer to encourage the children to behave and conduct themselves responsibly in public places.

Etchells Community Exercise Track

As I mentioned in the Newsletter last week, we are currently planning to replace our wood chip path around the school field with an all-weather track which will also enable easier access to our log circle areas. We are having to raise a considerable amount of money for this and one route we are looking at is the National Lottery. In order to secure a grant this way, we have to ensure the facility can be used by the community.

We have a few ideas: one being that we open the track on certain days after school to allow families and community members to run, jog (or walk!) and safely get some exercise away from the roads and pavements.

We are also asking local Brownie/Cubs/Beaver groups if they would like to use the track or Forest School areas, perhaps once a term. Our Cycle Buddies friends may also make use of the track.

Railway Safety



I have been contacted by the Community Safety Manager at Network Rail whose role it is to ensure people understand the dangers both on and near the railway, as well as spreading awareness of the farreaching consequences of someone's decision to trespass on the railway.

They have informed me of the most recent incidents involving young people in our area:

05/04/2021 - 6 youths on the track between Heald Green and Gatley.

 $\underline{06/04/2021}$ – three youths by the access point near Heald Green station (on the public side of the fence when line examined)

<u>13/04/2021</u> – Three youths on the embankment near Heald Green North <u>15/04/2021</u> – Three youths sat on access gate steps.

We have been asked to share the following messages: Key messages:

- At present the trains are still running (although this may be at different times to usual so never presume you know when the next train will pass)
- It is against the law to trespass on the railway and can result in a fine of £1000
- The Electricity is **ALWAYS** switched on around the railway
- Always **Stop, Look and Listen** before using a Level Crossing
