# POLLING STATION

Until we can get all the children safely back into the hall, we will be unable to extend the hot meal provision for  $Y_5/6$ .

# Co-Production Charter

In previous newsletters, I have brought your attention to the Co-Production Charter, developed by The Local Authority. The aim is to provide all those involved with children with SEND with a productive and pro-active approach. It is important to keep re-visiting the charter and consider whether the principles are being applied. The concept of Co-production was developed and defined as:

Co-production happens when all voices are actively listened to from the start of the planning process. This involves a mutual respect for each other's views, with an open and honest relationship that is transparent and continually evolving to achieve meaningful and positive outcomes.

In short, this means that families, children, young people and health, care and education colleagues will all work in partnership following these principles:

- Be open and honest
- Actively listen
- Value the lived experience
- Oo what matters
- Be accountable and responsive
- Work together
- Be respectful
