COVID-19: Updated Guidance

As you will be well aware, last week some of the lockdown restrictions were lifted nationally. However, as a school, very little has changed and the guidance and risk assessments we have been using still remain in place. One exception to this is that we are now able to take children on educational visits - both residential and for the day.

Therefore, we need to ask you to continue to wear face coverings on the school premises, keep your distance and follow the one way system. Please ensure you use the correct entrance - only Nursery and Reception should be entering via the Nursery gate. Years 1 to 4 should enter via the park-side gate and Years 5 and 6 through the front door. In the coming weeks, we will be reviewing the staggered start and finish times, so please watch this space for further information.

Communications

Once again, I need to stress to parents, not to use ClassDojo messaging to report a child's absence. It is vital this information goes straight to the school office as this is where the registers are checked and managed. Now the teachers are in the classrooms full time, they will no longer be doing a daily check on messages and important information can be missed. If we do not know where a child is on any given morning, we have to make a welfare phone call home as part of our safeguarding procedures. Please remember you can leave a message on the absence voicemail at any time, clearly stating your child's name, class and reason for absence.
