Outdoor Learning and Forest School

A significant part of our School Development Plan this year is to improve the use of our outdoor space in order to develop outdoor learning and Forest School teaching. We are aiming to identify many opportunities to take the children outside for a

wide range of subjects as not only does this increase their motivation and enjoyment of learning, it also provides a huge stimulus for vocabulary, imagination and opportunities for exploration.

After Easter, we will be delivering Forest School Education; each year group will have a half term slot working with our Forest School teacher Mrs Plumb. You will be receiving more information about this nearer the time but if you'd like to know more have a look at this website.

We have a team of teachers led by Mrs Mallinson who are looking at improving our outdoor area and making it more suitable for outdoor learning and Forest School. We are hoping to create 2 or 3 covered areas where classes can be out of either the rain or sun, as well as some willow structures such as tunnels and a dome. The Eco team are keen to install a bird hide and improve the habitat for wildlife, and we would like to install poly tunnels to enable us to grow produce throughout the year. The plan also involves planting of additional trees including a fruit orchard. A willow fence (known as a 'fedge') will also be planted round the Reception outdoor classroom area.

We are delighted that the PTA have agreed to fund the willow structures which will need to be planted by the end of March. They will also be assisting us in creating a path around the field to divide the play area in the middle and the learning areas round the outside. If anyone knows someone with a digger or access to reduced cost materials such as bark, path edging and membrane we would be grateful to hear from you. We will also be applying for a range of grants to help us fund this project.




Kidzone Breakfast and After School Club
