## RSPB Birdwatch | Safer Internet Day | Parent Council

Our Eco-Team, with the help of Mrs Lambert and Mrs Gunn, were outside last week participating in the annual RSPB birdwatch. This is a national event which enables the RSPB to acquire a bird population count. Our spotters counted lots of pigeons and gulls and recorded an increase in sightings of blue tits and robins. The eco-team are currently looking at how we can improve our grounds to encourage more birdlife and are hoping to raise funds to acquire a hide for more camouflaged bird spotting!



Even though we address the issue of safe internet usage with the children throughout the year, we will be marking Safer Internet Day next week with some focussed activities and discussions.
