**Additional Adults** Mrs Choudhury, Mrs Lee & Miss Johnson Welcome back to your final term of Year 5! We hope that you had a lovely holiday and are refreshed and ready to continue working hard and enjoying your learning...

This term we will begin our topic 'Rogues, Raiders, Invaders...?' which is a historical and geographical study of the struggle for Britain during the Dark Ages (predominantly investigating the Anglo Saxons and Vikings as reluctant neighbours). This topic will be host to lots of practical historical enquiry, purposeful outdoor learning and exciting role-play so we can really experience the lives of people from the past.

Through immersive drama, we will explore the mystery of the empty Saxon grave, scrutinise primary and secondary sources and even search for evidence of the Dark Ages in our school grounds!

In <u>Science</u>, we will be continuing our work on forces before moving onto our final Science topic of 'Animals, including Humans' where we will be learning about human timelines, the growth of babies, changes in old age, gestation periods of different animals and a lesson on puberty. This lesson will be split into two classrooms, with boys in one and girls in the other. We will give you notice before teaching this lesson and any resources will be available for you to look at prior to the lesson if you wish.

### <u>English</u>

This term we will begin with a focus on poetry and we will be learning about The Highwayman by Alfred Noyes. We will be deepening our understanding of different sentence structures that impact the reader as well as focusing on a range of grammatical terms.
Our teaching of reading will continue on a whole class basis; our main focus will move from retrieval and inference based questions to suggesting what impressions characters leave on the reader and finding evidence from the text to support our big 3 mark questions.

#### <u>Maths</u>

We will be continuing to consolidate the Year 5 AREs with more of a reasoning focus compared to the arithmetic focus we have had so far this year. We will start by looking at decimals (adding, subtracting rounding) then converting between fractions, decimals and percentages before moving onto looking at angles in different shapes and turns. We will then be going back to consolidate our learning on previous topics. You can help your child to make further progress by practising telling the time (analogue and digital), reading timetables, practising times tables and using CGP books.

### Weekly Learning to be Completed at Home

## Reading

Your child will read to us during whole class reading sessions and will continue to be expected to read independently on a daily basis (at school and at home). Please continue to sign your child's diary whenever you have listened to them read - at least 3 times a week. We will continue with our weekly reading raffle on a Friday.

## Maths

We will continue to set a weekly maths activity on a Monday, which is due to be handed back in by the following Monday. These activities will be fluency based and aim to revisit topics we are covered in school—please feel free to message Mrs Roberts if you are ever unsure of any of the homework tasks.

Children should also continue to ensure they have rapid recall of multiplication and division facts up to 12x12.
