Assessment Tests for Year 2 and Year 6

<u>Year 6</u>

Next week Year 6 will be taking their SATs tests in Reading, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling, as well as Mathematics. They will sit the tests at the same time as all other 10 and 11 year olds in the country. We aim to keep the children as relaxed as possible about the tests whilst also giving them the best chance to do well and perform to their full ability. We ask parents to ensure that bedtimes next week are not too late, screen time kept to a minimum and that children attend the breakfast club before school. A letter has been sent home to Y6 about the breakfast club; this gives the children a chance to socialise, eat breakfast and relax with their friends a little before school. No charge is made for the club.

We wish our Year 6 the best of luck and hope you have the opportunity to shine and show off your skills.

Year 2

Year 2 will also be taking SATs over the next few weeks. However, it is much less formal for them and the teachers can choose when best to do the tests within a given time frame. We strive to make the conditions as normal as possible for the children within their own classroom environments. We suggest that Y2 also have early bedtimes, limited screen time and good breakfasts over the coming weeks.

Parent Council and Mathematics

Keeping Active



Next Tuesday we will be welcoming Freddy Fit back into school. For the majority of the day, he will be

working with our Year 5 pupils, training them up to be lunchtime play leaders when they are in Year 6. He will also be delivering our whole school sponsored active session in order to raise money for a defibrillator. Freddy will be finishing his day with a stress busting exercise session for Year 6!

Year 6 are to come to school on Tuesday in their school uniform and bring a sports kit to get changed into.

Prompt Pick Up Needed Please!!

We are finding that an increasing number of children are being picked up late - some as late as 3.45pm. We cannot look after children after 3.15pm - teachers are in meetings and the office staff are extremely busy and often have to leave the office which means children are left unattended. Children who are not being picked up on time will be referred to the Education Welfare Officer and a formal parent contract will have to be put in place. If this is not followed, a fine can be issued.

Enrichment Afternoons

All teachers have an entitlement to PPA (Planning, Preparation and Assessment) time each week. We have now changed the way that this is covered and have introduced enrichment afternoons. Years 1, 2 and 3 have their session on Tuesday afternoon and Years 4, 5 and 6 have theirs on Wednesdays. Early Years take their time on Tuesday mornings. During these sessions the children will take part in a wide range of activities as well as an assembly at the end of the day instead of during the morning.

We are introducing Forest School to all Year groups over the coming months as well as increased outdoor learning opportunities. The children will also take part in Philosophy4Children sessions, have Spanish taught by a professional fluent speaker, develop practical skills such as sewing, increase outdoor adventurous activities (part of the PE curriculum) with orienteering and develop team building skills.

We have been running the programme for 2 weeks now and so far it has been a real success. The children will have a half term on each activity.
