Waterproof clothing and suitable footwear should be brought for Forest School and Outdoor Learning days. The blue school sweatshirt should be worn at all times, <u>every day of the week.</u>

We will be implementing this in September. Please also remember that Jewellery or nail varnish should not be worn at anytime.
