Attendance

We continue to work tirelessly to improve the attendance of our pupils. Our Ofsted inspection in 2016 left us with two clear targets, one of them being:

"Work with pupils and families to improve attendance, particularly of those who are frequently absent."

The overall attendance for the school each half term has consistently being sitting just below the National Average of 96%. I am delighted that at October half term the new percentage from September stood at 96.5%. This is the highest it has been for a long time. We only had 4 classes below the National Average, with the lowest percentage being 95%.

Our thanks to all the families who have responded to our requests to take holidays during the school holidays and have kept other absences to a minimum. We have however, a number of families who are still taking term time holidays - these do not get authorised and we have had a record number of EPNs (Education Penalty Notices - fines) going out to parents in the last few weeks. The Local Authority have stepped up the number of EPNs being issued since September and families with

children who are persistently absent will be put under a Parent Contract. It is a legal obligation to send your child to school and failure to comply with this can lead to court proceedings and 4 figure fines.

I really hope we can keep the momentum going with our current attendance figures and ask for your support in meeting this very important Ofsted target. The table opposite indicates precisely why it is so important for children to attend school regularly.

If your attendance is 95% you have missed 9 days and 50 lessons If your attendance is 90% you have missed 19 days and 100 lessons If your attendance is 85% you have missed 29 days and 150 lessons If your attendance is 80% you have missed 38 days and 200 lessons If your attendance is 75% you have missed 48 days and 250 lessons If your attendance is 70% you have missed 57 days and 290 lessons If your attendance is 65% you have missed 67 days and 340 lessons If you want to succeed you must come to school!!

Homework sheets were sent home yesterday. Thank you for your continuing support with the homework. We can't stress enough how important learning the basic skills of counting, times tables, spelling and reading is. The creative and writing tasks encourage parents to become involved with their child's learning which research has proven to be more effective than weekly worksheets.
