The HMI (Mark Williams) will be linked with the school until its next inspection and will support us through the improvement process. On Monday he will meet with governors, the senior leadership team, the Local Authority and most importantly will be visiting classrooms and looking at progress in the children's workbooks. He will also meet with a group of pupils to talk to them.

A letter will be written to myself which will summarise the findings of the day. This will be published on the Ofsted website and we will also publish it on our own school website.

When I spoke to Mr Williams yesterday, he asked me to encourage parents to give their opinion of the school and the progress it's making through 'Parent View' which can be found on the Ofsted website.
