Travel Survey Response

We had over 150 responses to the travel survey that was sent home before the half term holiday. This has really helped us develop an up to date picture of how our families travel to school and provided suggestions for improvements. Mrs Mallinson has collated all the responses and we were not surprised to find that a similar percentage of children walk to school (45%) as come in the car (42%). 28% of parents said they would consider an alternative method of travel to school which is great.

Going forward, we are working closely with the Local Authority and Stockport Council to make improvements to the local area. We have proposed a crossing island across Finney Lane, bollards on the pavement outside school and safety rails opposite the entrances into school. We now have to write a report putting forward our case for these measures to be put in place. Decisions are of course driven by budgets but we do know we are high up the priority list of schools in Stockport.

The yellow zig zag lines and double yellow lines have recently been re-evaluated and now fully conform with highway regulations.



We did put out the suggestion of a walking bus which would enable parents to park away from school and drop children with volunteers who would walk the pupils to school. There was a lot of interest in this scheme and a good

number of parents are willing to volunteer to help. This would entail dedicating one morning a week or more, to walk from an agreed starting point, such as The Griffin, to school.
