A number of referrals for EPNs (Education Penalty Notice) have been made which could ultimately result in fines.

Smart Watch and Mobile Phone Reminder

We are aware that some children have received Fitbits and smart watches for Christmas. Due to the high cost of these items, they are not allowed in school. We also have to take precautions regarding the advanced abilities of these devices, for example, cameras, microphones etc. If a child comes to school with a smart watch or Fitbit it will be taken to the office and will need to be collected by an adult.

Some of our older children who walk to school unaccompanied, have a mobile phone. Please note that an agreement form must be completed and the phone is to be left at the office, in a named case or bag, for safekeeping. The policy and consent form can be obtained from the school office.
