As you are aware, HMI (Her Majesty's Inspectors) are monitoring very closely the progress we are making as a school, in meeting the targets for improvement identified at the last inspection. One of the key areas for us to develop is the teaching of Maths. Over the last term we have been working hard on developing the calculation policy, improving problem solving as well as providing greater challenge and more focussed feedback in children's books. I have monitored the books closely and have been delighted with the improvements made. The children are also very positive about their learning and yesterday, a small group of pupils told me how helpful the marking was and how they enjoyed the challenges they now tackle across the curriculum.

Mr Mark Williams (HMI) will be visiting us on Tuesday next week and will be focussing on maths in every age group of the school. He will look at plans, books, lesson observation notes and will ask us about the evidence we have to prove how well we think we are doing. We are looking forward to sharing the achievements so far and are confident improvements will be identified since his last visit. I will inform you of his findings in the newsletter next week.
