## **HMI feedback**

I informed all parents last week that HMI would be visiting us this Tuesday. The focus of the day was Maths and the development of the Maths subject leaders. We looked at children's work throughout school, identifying evidence of good progress in calculations and problem solving, as well as how effective marking is. On this occasion, a published report will not be made though I received a brief email from HMI Mark Williams yesterday. He commented on the sharpness of the Maths leaders in identifying strengths and areas for development in maths. He also praised the Senior Leadership Team's ability to ask challenging questions about progress and practice in maths. He recognised that both teachers and pupils are using the top tips and reflective comments increasingly well to further pupils' knowledge, skills and understanding.

Under the guidance of the HMI, the Maths leaders were able to identify exactly what our next steps need to be in the improvement of Maths and where any inconsistencies lie. Work has begun immediately in addressing these areas. Mark Williams will return in the summer term to assess how well we are doing.

Next term sees some extremely important periods of assessment for certain year groups. Here is a brief outline of the key dates, who it involves and what you can do at home to support:

Year Group	Assessment	Date	What you can do at home
6	KS2 SATs	W/b Mon 11th May - all week	Complete any additional revision homework set by teachers. You can also purchase your own revision books very cheaply from <u>www.cgpbooks.co.uk</u>
2	KS1 SATs	In class during May	Please continue to read daily with your child, questioning them about their understanding of the text. Practise any maths facts set by the teachers. Encourage your children to write using correct punctuation and adventurous words.
1	Phonics screening	W/b 15th June	Attendance in school from now and up to this date is vitally important as your child will continue to receive daily phonics teaching. You can also practise reading real and 'nonsense' words on the websites recommended by the teachers.
