### Lunchtime discipline

We are trialling a new approach to discipline at lunchtimes. We are striving to keep the excellent level of behaviour observed in the classrooms, equally as good out on the playground. Therefore, the MDAs (Mid-day Assistants) will now be operating a yellow/red card system. The yellow card will be used as a warning that behaviour is not appropriate. If it continues the red card will be used and the child will be sent into school to spend the rest of the lunchtime with a member of the senior leadership team. If this proves to be successful we will add it into our behaviour policy which can be found on the website.

#### **Online Maths Homework**

A while ago the Parent Council fed back to us that the timer used on the Active Learn online maths homework was causing many frustrations with children working hard to complete tasks. The timer was adding unnecessary pressure and demotivating pupils. One of our Maths leaders, Mrs Wilson, spoke directly with the company and we have just been informed that changes are in the pipeline. We have been told that the timer will be removed for bronze and silver tasks, but will still be in place for gold tasks to add that extra level of challenge. We hope these changes take place soon and that it makes a difference to the maths homework. Please remember that anyone finding it difficult to access the homework on line can use the ICT suite for the first 20 minutes of every lunchtime.



Our links with The Kingsway School continue to go from strength to strength. The Year 3 and 4 are currently working with the Design and Technology staff on practical projects and thoroughly enjoying their learning. An open evening is being held at The Kingsway School for Year 4 and 5 pupils and their families on Thursday 9th July 5 - 7.3 opm.
