We would really appreciate it if this policy is followed and respected.



Medicines

Just a reminder that all medicines which need to be administered to children should be brought to the school office by an adult. A form needs to be filled out so we are clear about the dosage and frequency of the medication. We have had some incidences of medicines being handed to staff or children bringing them in themselves. We are happy to administer medicine but we do have to follow Health and Safety procedures.

If your child suffers with asthma, please could you ensure that we hold an inhaler at school in case it is needed. Again, please bring it to the office and ensure it is named. Many thanks.



Appointments

We continue to have a significant number of children attending medical or dental appointments during the school day. We appreciate that some appointments such as those with hospital consultants or Speech and Language Therapists are long awaited and difficult to change, but do request that routine appointments are made out of school hours. If you do have an appointment during the school day, please bring in a copy of your appointment card so it can be verified.



Jewellery and Nail Varnish

I would like to remind both pupils and parents that nail varnish and jewellery should not be worn to school. This includes items such as necklaces and bracelets. We are seeing more and more of these being worn which can pose a safety risk as well as the potential for them being lost. Only stud earrings should be worn for school and they must be removed for PE by the child. If this isn't possible, micropore tape needs to be placed over them. This is Local Authority guidance. We would be grateful if you could send tape into school with your child and show them how to apply it themselves.

3 Day Nanny
