Nursery Hours

We are considering changing the hours for our Nursery provision in order to make it easier for parents to arrange childcare and fit around work hours. We are proposing to change from 5 mornings or 5 afternoons to 2 and a half full days i.e. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday morning or Wednesday afternoon, Thursday, Friday.

We would very much value your opinion about this - even if you don't have children who will be starting nursery in the near future. It is very difficult for us to canvas prospective nursery parents as we don't yet know who they are, so your opinion as parents, is very important to us.

If you are a current Nursery parent, you will be receiving a letter asking you to indicate your preference for the hours. Please note however, that these changes will not be taking place until September 2016.

Parents of all other year groups can indicate your opinion by filling in the online survey on our website. To do this you need to log on with your password, select the 'Surveys and Forms' tab and then click 'Nursery Hours'. It is a very quick multiple choice question. If you would like to make a comment, you can do so on the parent forum which has been set up for this subject.

The children are really enjoying earning their badges and wear them with pride. Please remember that when a silver badge is earned, it must be exchanged with the bronze badge. Unfortunately, the badges are expensive and we are unable to let the children keep them. At the end of the year, certificates will be given to celebrate the level the children have reached. Any 'Wow' badges (150 merits) awarded will be able to be kept at the end of the year as this will be such an outstanding achievement.
