This week I met with our Education Welfare Officer (EWO) to discuss the attendance and punctuality of all the children in the school. We meet with the EWO every 4 weeks to monitor attendance and to address individual cases where a drop in attendance is giving us cause for concern. We have been advised to remind parents that the children should be in school for registration at 8.55am. Arrival after this time and before 9.20am will be recorded as Late. After 9.20am, the absence is recorded as Late after registers close.

You will find that for Years 1-6, the APP sheets (Assessing Pupil Progress) can now be found in the front of the English and Maths book, rather than in a separate booklet. You can see clearly which level your child is working within and the mid-term report will give you an indication of whether this is in line with national expectations for your child's age. You will see that some statements are ticked and others highlighted. Children have to show 3 times that they are able to carry out the statements and then it is highlighted to show it has been achieved. We hope this will give you a clear idea of exactly what is needed for your child to make progress and which areas need further development.
