Topic

Our topic this term is: What Have the Romans Done For Us? We will be looking at timelines, daily life, religion, the invasion of Britain, the Roman army and the legacy of the Romans: city planning, Romanesque architectural style, cultural distinctions (ethnicity), Roman engineering (aqueducts, sewage systems, dams, cement, and arches).

English

Here are some of the exciting genres and texts we will cover in our English lessons this term:

- Stories based on Shaun Tan's 'The Lost Thing'
- non-chronological report– Daily life in Ancient Rome
- leaflets The Roman Army Needs You! / Etchells Primary School
- explanation texts- Roman Bath Houses / Roman Gods

We will continue to follow the same school-based approach to the teaching of spellings, so these will not come home. Please focus instead on daily reading and times tables practice.

Maths

Rapid and accurate multiplication recall is a big part of our maths. Please continue to practise at home every day. This is really important because we have to take part in the national multiplication check in June, where children will have six seconds to read each question, work out the answer and type it in. Speed is the name of the game!

In Maths lessons, we will be finishing off our unit of work on Fractions, before moving on to decimals. We then cover money and shape.

One of the topics will include time which many children struggle with so extra help at home would really help.

Puberty

We will deliver the talk at the beginning of this term, to the Year 4 boys and girls separately. You will be informed in advance before the session. Should you wish to look at the resources used in school beforehand, please contact your child's class teacher.

Topic Homework

The children will be given a wide variety of tasks to choose from. We expect them to complete at least two by **26th May** for Summer 1. Please continue to send homework via Dojo Portfolio wherever possible, this makes it easy for your child to share their lovely work with the class.

Reading

Your child will continue to be given an individual reading book; please ensure that you sign in the reading diary each time you read with your child at home. Dojos are awarded for good use of reading diaries! In addition, all children have the chance to visit school's fabulous KS2 library every week to select a book to read for the sheer enjoyment of it.

Naming Clothing

Particularly in the summer term, when children often shed their jumpers/cardigans/jackets as they play outside, we face a huge problem with lost property! Please ensure that each and every item of your child's uniform is clearly named so that lost items can be easily sent back to their owners.

Snacks and Drinks:

The children should bring a named water bottle into school every day; this is particularly important in the summer months. Additionally, a healthy snack for playtime is encouraged. We often have hungry children at playtime with nothing to snack on!
