### Welcome back to your child's last term at Etchells

This term, our topical investigation will be —"<u>How was Britain rebuilt after the</u> <u>second World War?</u> We will study the years after the end of WWII where a number of extraordinary changes took place in Britain. As post-war plans for rebuilding Britain were implemented, virtually every aspect of British life was affected. By the mid-1960s, Britain had undergone a transformation. Our 'Rebuilding Britain' topic covers this period of modern British history in-depth, starting with her involvement in the war.

### English writing

We will continue to be inspired by a range of texts and authors in our writing. We will be thinking carefully about the audience and purpose of our writing in order to select appropriate form and vocabulary choices.

### English Reading and SPaG

We will be preparing for the SATs Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) Test with daily revision along with daily reading VIPERS to support our preparation for our reading assessment.

### <u>Maths</u>

In Maths, we will be continuing to ready ourselves for the SATs, we will be revising all mathematical skills prior to our SATs assessments in May. We will then have a focus on practical maths skills, such as the use of spreadsheets and creating household budgets.

#### Science:

Our Science topics for the summer term are: The human circulatory system and Electricity. In electricity we will be looking at how the heart works and the effects of exercise on the body. In electricity, the children will be creating circuits, problem solving and exploring different ways that they can create the most effective circuit.

### PSHE:

This term we will be learning about RSE, including changes to our bodies, sex as part of a healthy relationship, human reproduction - from conception to birth. We will also look at how to keep our bodies safe, including hygiene and consensual physical contact. We will explore the role of the LGBTQ community, including the human rights and the history of LGBTQ campaigners. All resources can be viewed be arrangement with your child's class teacher.
