Today you will receive an envelope from your child containing their Mid-Term Review and 2 copies of the Home-School Agreement. Please read the letter accompanying these documents for further explanation. One copy of the signed Home-School Agreement should be handed to the class teacher at parents' evening next week.

#### Parents' Evening

Please ensure you have booked a parents' evening appointment. Around a third of parents have not yet made an appointment. This is a really important point in the academic year to meet with your child's teacher and to find out about the progress they are making. I am particularly concerned about the low numbers of Year 6 parents engaging with this opportunity. The booking on the school website will remain open until the end of Monday. <u>Appointments will not be allocated on the day.</u>

Please take the opportunity to look at your child's workbooks before your appointment with the teacher. There is a national drive to reduce teachers' workload in schools and so you may well notice there has been a reduction in the quantity of marking in the books. Teachers can often have over 90 books to mark in one evening, which I'm sure you will agree, is not sustainable after a full day's work. We have been looking at ways to reduce written comments whilst still maintaining quality feedback to pupils. Marking is done during the lessons, with the pupils where possible, which enables children to make an immediate response. Feedback can also be given orally and the pupils given time to make improvements with their purple pen. The older pupils are getting increasingly involved in self-assessing their work and setting their own targets.

In the front of English and Maths books you will find your child's ARE tracker (Age Related Expectation) sheet. You will see what has been achieved so far this year and what has yet to be covered or areas your child is finding difficult. The class teacher will be able to talk to you about this.
