Ofsted October 2021

I am pleased to be able to attach the final report for our recent Ofsted inspection which took place in October. We are delighted that after such a challenging 18 months, we have remained a 'good' school. The report is extremely positive about the Etchells Curriculum, as well as our provision for children with SEND and pupils' personal development. Ofsted have a significant focus on reading and phonics at the moment and we were very pleased that all our hard work in this area was recognised. The report states: "The teaching of reading, and developing a love of reading, are high priorities across the school.....All staff use the school's phonics programme consistently well..."

I was particularly pleased that the children were recognised for their excellent behaviour and attitudes towards their learning. The inspector told me that every classroom she went in, the children were fully engaged with their learning. She reports: "Most (children) are much too busy enjoying their learning to distract each other."

All Ofsted reports give at least two areas for further improvement. Our first is regarding subject leaders checking up on the curriculum in the same way as we did before the pandemic. I'm pleased to say that we had already started this the week before the inspection, with all subject leads having time to look at pupil's work so far and look at planning. It is great to be able to resume this work once again, now that staff are not restricted to their bubbles.

Our second area is around subject plans being refined to incorporate the new Early Years curriculum which was introduced this September. Whilst the Nursery and Reception staff are confident with new framework, we have staff training planned for the subject leaders in January.

My thanks to all the staff for their tremendous ongoing hard work and commitment; achieving such positive comments after all the disruption deserves huge congratulations. My thanks to all the parents who gave such positive feedback to the inspector and we have taken on board the comments from others regarding improvements. And finally, special recognition should go to our amazing pupils who have shown resilience, determination and risen to the challenges presented to them. For the children to demonstrate such an enjoyment for their learning means everything to us. The Core Values, which underpin our provision here at Etchells, could not have shone through more strongly. The children told the inspector that the Core Values "help us become a better person and they give us the motivating message 'You can do this'."
