Our induction Visits – New to Etchells only

Tomorrow - Thursday 3rd July, Monday 7th July and Thursday 17th July 9.30-10.30am

- New children and parents to <u>arrive at our nursery gate at</u>
 9.30am.
- Parents to stay please our chance to meet you personally.
- Opportunity for you and your child to become familiar with teachers and reception building.
- Please let us know any important information and if your child already knows a friend who will also be starting Etchells.
- Our current nursery children are already very familiar with the reception building and staff!

Is your child ready for school?

Skills that the children need:

- Confidence to leave their parents
- Recognise their name to find their drawer and peg
- Take off & put on shoes/wellies (on the right feet!)
- Put on & take off their coat and jumpers/cardigans (without it turning inside out – pull from the sleeves!)
- Use <u>a knife and fork</u> to eat (not a spoon)
- Wipe/blow own nose
- Use toilet independently for both!

Please practise over the Summer

Those crucial first days in September - Induction

- We try to get the children into school as soon as possible but we strongly believe this needs to be done gently!
- It's a big step for most children, even those who have been to pre-school full time.
- Our current nursery children are already familiar but our new children aren't, so will benefit from smaller groups.

- Some children are confident to bounce into school on day one, however, there are some who are not and need a little extra time from our staff team.
- 2 Registration groups initially
 flexible, may change.

What will happen in September? Tuesday 2nd September

MORNING - CURRENT NURSERY attend (without parents) - 8.55-11.25pm

<u>AFTERNOON - NEW TO ETCHELLS</u> - You are asked to come to school <u>with your</u> <u>child</u> for an hour in small groups. Your times will be on your invitation to be sent to you soon.

- This gives you the opportunity to meet with us to discuss your child and inform us of anything you feel would be of benefit for us to know before they start.
- It also allows them time to familiarise themselves with us and the reception building with you before we ask you to leave them with us.
- Urgent matters? Please let us know if there is anything you feel we should know BEFORE your child starts school in September. Otherwise, there will be plenty of opportunity once they have started school with us.
- Please come to the nursery gate

Wednesday 3rd

- Half day (without parents)
- On these days your child will attend for one morning session <u>or</u> one afternoon session.
- Wednesday morning our current nursery -8.55-11.25
- Wednesday afternoon– new to Etchells - 1.15-3.15
- Useful to help to introduce/re-establish routines and for the children to familiarise themselves with the Reception building in smaller groups.
- Please come to the nursery gate at 11.25 or 1.15 (usual gates will be open for 8.55 and 3.15)

Thursday 4thth September

- All children will come to school in the morning plus lunch until 1pm.
- All reception, year 1 & 2 children are entitled to a free hot school meal if you choose or you can send in a packed lunch if you prefer.
- This is the children's first taste of all being together and having lunch at school in the hall!
- Sandwiches may be provided at first before the children are introduced to a hot school meal.



Please come to our nursery gate to collect children at 1pm

Friday 5th September onwards

- All of the children in full time if they are ready.
- If you feel they aren't quite ready we can discuss a phased part time and increase hours gradually.
- School meals are on a 2 week rota, menus are available on our website.
- You choose their meals online it is useful if you can check the menu and discuss with your child what they might like.
- There is always a meat, Halal, vegetarian option or jacket potato (with cheese/beans/tuna) and salad.

Packed Lunches

- If you prefer to provide a packed lunch from home, lunch boxes can be stored under the children's coat pegs.
- NOT REFRIGERATED so please NO dairy/meat products that are likely to 'go off'
- We encourage HEALTHY EATING
- No hard sweets or lollies please (choking hazards)
- Please don't send new/unfamiliar foods at first.
- Not too much food, can be overwhelming.
- Please practise opening/closing lunch boxes and flasks.
- Any uneaten food will be returned home.

NO NUTS!

We have several children and staff who are <u>severely</u> allergic to nuts.

- PLEASE DO NOT SEND IN ANY PRODUCTS CONTAINING NUTS IN PACKED LUNCHES.
- Birthday treats we are a 'Healthy School' so our parent council have requested that no cakes or sweets are brought in for birthdays or other celebrations please.



Open Snack Bar

- Healthy snacks fruit, vegetables and a drink of water.
- All children to bring a
 <u>water</u> bottle each day –
 named please.
- Bananas, apples, pears, satsumas, raisins available ...there's always a variety!
- Children can bring their own fruit or veg if they prefer



Start of the school day

- Gates open and teachers are on the playground from 8:45am. If there is anything
 you would like to speak to us about, this is the best time to do so.
- 8.55am gates and doors close.
- Once the children have come into school they are then our priority and we may not be available to talk to you.
- We encourage independence!
- We ask confident children to come in first. Please don't come into the cloakroom. The children can become frightened if too many adults come in with children and so we respectfully ask you to leave your child at the door. Then, those who need help can be brought in, in small groups supported by staff until they gain the confidence to do so themselves.
- We suggest that if your child is reluctant to hold back or arrive a little later and wait until we can give them the adult attention that they need to reassure them.

- Telephone the school office/leave a message we can call you back if we are unable to talk to you immediately.
- Call to see us early, before the start of school; but please not as the children are arriving or leaving.
- We can arrange a mutually convenient time.
- Please don't message on Dojo, we may not see it!

End of the school day

- The school day ends at 3:15pm
- We try to let out just before the bell so that you can collect your youngest first.
- Please arrive promptly, it can be very upsetting for young children to be collected late.
- Please contact us if you are running late. We can then reassure your child.

School Uniform

Available to buy until end of term or in September

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- White polo shirt not full button shirts
- We recommend black joggers or leggings initially – easier for children to manage
- Blue cardigan or jumper (These can be with Etchells logo or plain)
- <u>VELCRO shoes</u> no laces please!
- Grey trousers or skirt/tunic

PE/FOREST SCHOOLS UNIFORM

- PE white T-shirt, black jogging bottoms or leggings, black trainers
- FOREST SCHOOLS same clothes as PE but with waterproof coat and trousers and wellington boots
- Forest school Tuesdays
- PE days TBC

Important Items

- We request a pair of wellington boots and wet weather clothing for your child to keep at school for outdoor learning/Forest Schools throughout the year.
- Please send a coat every day

 The children are outside for
 1 hour after lunch and for
 outdoor learning whatever
 the weather!

- Please practise dressing and undressing – buttons, zips, shoes, gloves etc.
- Spare underwear on peg is advised – accidents happen!
- Book bags Bring empty at first to help set routine of bringing them every day.
- PLEASE NAME EVERYTHING!!!
- Useful to put one keyring or badge on for easy identification.

Absence

- If your child is unwell please telephone school on the <u>first day</u> of absence and <u>each day</u> thereafter.
- Attendance is a high priority for safeguarding.
- EWO (Education Welfare Officer) regularly checks attendance.

Medicine, Asthma and allergies



- Please inform us of <u>any</u> medical conditions or allergies, especially if these change throughout the year.
- Asthma Inhalers are kept in the classrooms, but other medication needs to be signed in to a member of staff and a medicine form completed.
- We can also administer Calpol or Antihistamine as long as we have <u>a signed consent form</u>
- Medicines are administered by a first aider.
- Any medical information regarding your child may be shared if necessary with our school nurse to ensure that we are fully meeting the needs of your child.
