Homework

We have listened carefully to comments and feedback given to us at Parent's Evening regarding homework. After discussions with the Senior Leadership Team, we are happy to put the following changes in place:

KS2: just one written and one creative task to be completed, as well as reading, spellings, tables and maths tasks. In Year 6, homework will start to be set more regular and formally as the children prepare for their End of Key Stage Tests and their transition to High School.

KSI: written and creative tasks will still be set but these will be <u>optional</u>. To avoid pressure on parents, there will be no additional reward for completing these tasks. As parents however, it is worth knowing that tasks which involve parental engagement have a much greater influence on the child's progress than worksheet completion.

In KS1 it is vital that the counting and tables activities are completed and completed well. Fluency in counting and learning of number facts underpins the New National Curriculum in maths. Likewise, spelling and reading remain of upmost importance. We would like parents to focus on these tasks and complete the written/creative tasks as an optional extra.

After much consideration, we have decided that from April 2016, we will no longer continue with the Active Learn maths homework. We are looking into other forms of online maths homework which are very successful with other schools. In the meantime, we will try to vary what is set for maths, using a range of websites, apps and Active Learn for the time being.

New Building

We have been extremely lucky that the building project has gone almost without a hitch! The handover date was slightly delayed which made for a nail-biting time as we tried to coordinate removal men, staff time after school, furniture swapping and the emptying of the container which has been sitting at the front of the school these last few months. Due to a couple of paperwork delays, we were unable to move the children in until Wednesday afternoon, but they are now installed and really enjoying their new space. The staff have done an amazing job coming together as a fantastic team to get the four classrooms set up in record time.

Everyone is curious as to what the classrooms look like inside and so we are inviting you in for a quick peek! We will be opening the 4 new classrooms for all parents to have a look from 2.15pm on Friday 6th November. Please feel free to come inside and have a look around and talk to the children.
